Students in years 2-6 engage in the "Dirt Matters" program on Wednesday afternoons. Students are divided into four multi-aged groups. As well as their session


in the garden with Mr Crane and Mr Warren, they complete other activities with Mrs Sing. We are still working on our bush regeneration project.

Recently we have been talking about the effects of fire (wild fires and controlled burns) on bushland. We also explored some other natural disasters including meteor showers, typhoons and volcanic eruptions. Students worked in groups to select a disaster, research it and then complete some artwork to represent their disaster.

We are also working on devising a survey to see what different members of the community expect from a trail. Students worked in groups to discern the needs of older people, children, teachers and disabled people.
