"Lost Eden Creative" Gallery Tour & Workshop

The newest addition to our main street is the "Lost Eden Creative" gallery which was opened by Janet Holmes a Court in May. This 1940 property once served as shops and survived the 1961 fires. Over the last 18 months, owners Peter and Monique Tippett have transformed this property. The first exhibition is of Monique's own stunning artwork.

We were delighted when Monique offered a gallery tour / art workshops at the "Lost Eden Creative" to our students. Tours / workshops will happen regularly and all students in the school will participate.

The first group attended the gallery on Tuesday. Monique explained how the jarrah forest and nature generally inspires her work and how important it is that we all look after it. After the gallery tour **Monique** and **Nikki de Hoog** conducted a workshop with the students.

Before the visit students found something interesting in the bush that was used as inspiration for their own artwork. Students copied their piece of nature onto masking tape that was stuck onto wood veneer. Monique then cut around the shape and ash was glued into the shape. When the glue dried, the extra tape was removed and the natural object could be seen. The wood veneer was then decorated with charcoal and an extra leaf.


Our students are incredibly lucky to have this opportunity and I am very grateful to **Monique**. Thank you **Nikki** for your help!
