"Lost Eden Creative" Gallery Visit



We are very pleased and grateful that **Peter and Monique Tippett** are keen to involve our students in exhibitions that are held at their gallery.

At present, local photographer **Anne Sinclair** is holding an exhibition titled "**Habitat**" at the gallery. **Anne** talked to the students about her fabulous photography and made the following key points:

- Art tells a story.
- Art teaches us about new ideas in life and the world around us.
- Art is about emotions / feelings.

Anne then asked the question, "What is habitat?" Her key messages in response to this were as follows:

- Habitat is the natural home or environment of an animal, plant or organism.
- Habitat loss presents the greatest threat to wildlife.
- Dwellingup's habitat is displayed here in this exhibition.

Anne then made the following points about our jarrah forest:

- WE LOVE IT
- OTHER PEOPLE LOVE IT
- WE WANT TO KEEP IT
- WE NEED TO LEARN ABOUT IT.





Students in the junior classes were very interested in Mrs Sinclair's beautiful photos. They were amazed that there are so many beautiful birds in the jarrah forest. Mrs Sinclair taught students about the red capped parrot and they coloured one in. After that, they stuck a feather onto their page.





"This is not our world with trees in it. It's a world of trees, where humans have just arrived."


Book Week ~ Author Visit
