Staff Professional Learning

At Dwellingup Primary School we are always looking at ways to improve our practice to ensure that students' outcomes are maximised.

This week Mrs Sadler and Mrs Lamb completed a two day course titled "Talk for Writing" run by the Dyslexia-SPELD Foundation.

"The Talk for Writing approach enables children to read and write independently for a variety of audiences and purposes within different subjects. A key feature is that children internalise the language structures needed to write through 'talking the text' as well as close reading. The approach moves from dependence towards independence with the teacher using shared and guided teaching to develop the ability in children to write creatively and powerfully."

In week 6, Mrs Kinal and Mrs Bell are attending a course titled "Walker Learning" at Frederick Irwin Anglican School in Mandurah.

"Walker Learning is a holistic approach to teaching to the whole of a child and committed to developing children who can think for themselves and for others, can create and imagine, who are strong in their literacy and numeracy, and who can navigate the challenges of the world with intrinsic motivation and a strength of character made of a strong sense of self and resilience."

"Launched in 2009, the Dwellingup 100 has quickly become WA's largest one day mountain bike race, attracting plenty of newcomers and novices plus some of Australia's best riders. Once again we are excited to confirm that this event will be a part of the Western Australian Cross Country Marathon State Series (WA XCM State Series).

The event offers 4 different distance options for riders and 3 for runners (in the Mighty Jarrah Trail Run), including a 6km doggie dash for our best friends to join in on the fun.

Riders and runners who take on the challenge get to experience the best single track and fire trail the region has to offer. Those riding in the name-sake 100km Classic travel a course carefully curated by a team of mountain biking legends and course directors, led by the legendary Tony Tucknott.

Why Dwellingup? Aside from it offering some of the best trails in Western Australia, it's also a charming little town that's located just over an hour and a quarter south of Perth. "

Registrations are now open for the 'Dwellingup 100' and the 'Mighty Jarrah Trail Run'.
