# Why Choose Dwellingup Primary School?

Staff have been very busy over recent weeks conducting a range of end of year tests and then completing your child's report. It is very gratifying to see the progress that has been made by each and every child throughout the year. Each child has an Individual Profile. **Progress** is monitored throughout the year and interventions are provided where necessary. All students work at their own level, not their class level. This means that progress beyond their year level can occur. Our Mini / Multilit program run by Ms Wagenaar, prevents targeted students from 'slipping through the gaps'.

We believe that our school's decision to invest funds in the Chaplaincy program significantly contributes to our students' well-being which translates to a happier child and improved learning outcomes. We are very fortunate to have Mrs Ferraro; who I believe is the 'Rolls Royce' of Chaplains. We value her contribution to our school.

The graph below shows the progress our students made from year 3 to year 5 in their NAPLAN test this year. All schools aspire to achieving "high progress / high achievement and we have achieved this due to the quality teaching and programmes

that are provided at this school. Most schools have a spread around the middle of the two axes.

The dedication, commitment and passion to do their very best for each and every child demonstrated by all of our staff is second to none.

In addition to our academic focus, students at Dwellingup Primary School are provided with unique opportunities to be involved with their community. 





### **Road Safety Awareness Event**

On Tuesday Tania Gigg from SDERA (School Drug Education and Road Aware) and Constable Matt Payne from Dwellingup Police came to our school and delivered road safety activities.

Your children will be able to explain more about the activities described below.

<u>Stopping</u> <u>Distances</u> — demonstration and discussion. Students were made aware of how long a vehicle actually takes to stop after the brakes are applied.

It was impressed upon the students that even if the driver is aware (and not texting on their phone), it still takes much longer to stop than what you think. Make sure the road is clear before you cross it.

<u>Safety Door Demonstration</u> – students were shown the importance of using the safety door.

Students received a sticker to place on the safe door of their family car. Please see me if you have more than one car or if you would like one for grandma / grandpa or other relatives.

<u>Bike Safety</u> – discussion about various aspects of bike safety including the importance of wearing a bike helmet.

I showed the students the head of an anatomical model to demonstrate that our skull is relatively thin, that it encases our brain which controls a lot of bodily functions to highlight the need to protect the skull. We then completed a checklist and comparison of two helmets. This checklist accompanies this newsletter.


# Fremantle Prison / Shipwrecks Gallery Excursion


