





Cleanaway Waste Incursion

Students in years PP-6 participated in two **Cleanaway Waste Incursions** over the last two weeks. Topics included the following:


- Reducing Waste

Reduce, Reuse, Recycle School Incursion

Today your child participated in the first session of Cleanaway's Waste Incursion. Please find below some of the things we covered so you can discuss them as a family.

Reducing Waste



Smart Shopping

We looked at the choices we make when we go shopping and how that affects the amount of waste we bring into our homes.

Did you know when I buy a 1 kg block of cheese, I bring home 1 piece of waste, however if I buy an 8 pack of cheese sticks, I am bring home 9 pieces of waste, it cost more, I get less cheese but more waste.



Zero Waste Lunches

We talked about zero waste lunches, so we can reduce the amount of waste we bring to school. If you would like more ideas and information about this go to: www.nudefoodmovers.com.au



Reusing

We talked about ways we could reuse things like egg cartons and plastic bottles. The children came up with lots of awesome ideas. Ask your child about some of their ideas and see if you can come up with some of your own.

Recycling

We then moved on to recycling. We learnt our old drink can could be made into a new drink can, however because drink cans are made of aluminium, they could be made into lots of other aluminium products.





We looked at the items that belong in our home recycling bins. Your child might test you to see if you are putting the right items in your bin!

In the 2nd session we will learn about where recyclables go after being collected, by watching a video of Cleanaway's Materials Recovery Facility (MRF) in Perth.

Frequently Asked Questions?

Q. Does it really get recycled? I heard it all goes to landfill.

A. Yes it does get recycled as long as the correct items are placed in your recycling bin.

Q. Do I really need to wash my recycling, does it really matter?

A. Yes it does, this stops leftover food waste getting on paper and cardboard and contaminating it. Food waste can contaminate entire loads of recycling and it's important that it never goes in the recycling bin.

Q. Can I put shredded paper in the recycling bin?

A. No, it gets caught in the machines and ends up in the wrong place during sorting.

Q. Can plastic bags with the recycling symbol go in your home recycling bin?

A. No they can't. No soft plastics go in your recycling bin. They get caught up in the machines. However, it can go in the soft plastics bin at your local supermarket.

Q. If I put clothing in the recycling bin will it get reused?

A. No, unfortunately it ends up with small shards of glass in the fabric and is no longer safe to use and will end up in landfill. Take it to your nearest charity bin.

Q. What do the numbers mean on the plastic?

A. It shows what type of plastic the bottle is made from. However, you don't need to worry about this. If it is a plastic bottle or container, once it's clean it belongs in the recycling bin.

Q. It says to remove the lids from the bottle, but where does the lid go?

A. It depends on what the lid is made from. If it is made from steel, pop it in your home recycling bin. If it is made from plastic it doesn't belong in the home recycling bin.

Q. Can I put aerosols in?

A. No, aerosols are dangerous and pose a risk to MRF staff.

Q. Can all milk and juice cartons go in the recycling bin?

A. No, long life, silver lined cartons can't be recycled. How do you tell? If you get your milk and juice cartons off the shelf in the supermarket and not the refrigerator, then they probably have a silver lining.

Q. If I'm not sure it goes in the recycling bin, should I put it in just in case?

A. No, if you are not sure don't put it in the recycling bin. Contact your local council or your local waste contractor to check before putting it in.



What can I recycle?



Newspaper, paper & magazines



Milk & juice cartons (no foil lined cartons)



Steel & aluminium cans



Glass bottles & jars



Plastic bottles & containers (remove lid)



Cardboard boxes (please flatten)



No polystyrene, meat trays, cups & beads



No green waste or food waste



No gas bottles, flares, batteries or aerosols





No plastic bags or soft plastics



No textiles/ clothing



No nappies



Acceptable Recyclables List

Only the following items should be placed into the yellow-top recycling bin:

Aluminium

- All aluminium cans including:
 - o Beer cans
 - o Soft drink cans
 - o Coffee/Milo tins

Steel

- All steel cans/tins including:
 - o Food tins (rinsed)
 - o Pet food tins (rinsed)
- Beer bottle tops
- Jar lids

Cardboard

- Cardboard boxes (flattend)
- Beer cartons (flattened)
- Cereal boxes (remove bag)
- Egg cartons
- Greeting cards
- Toilet Paper/Paper towel rolls (roll only)
- Washing Powder boxes (empty)

Paper

- Newspapers
- Paper (not shredded)
- Paper bags
- Computer paper (not shredded)
- Envelopes
- Fruit juice cartons (not silver lined)
- Milk cartons (not silver lined)
- Glossy magazines/brochures
- Junk mail
- Wrapping paper

Plastic

- Milk bottles
- Soft drink bottles
- Water bottles
- Ice cream containers
- Margarine tubs
- Yoghurt containers
- Plastic containers from kitchen (rinsed and empty) ie sauce bottles
- Plastic containers from laundry (rinsed and empty) ie detergent bottles
- Plastic containers from bathroom (rinsed and empty) ie shampoo bottles
- Take-away food containers (rinsed, not polystyrene)

Glass

- Glass bottles and jars including:
 - o Beer bottles
 - o Coffee jars
 - o Sauce bottles (rinsed)
 - o Spirit bottles
 - o Wine bottles



ALL ITEMS SHOULD BE CLEAN, DRY AND EMPTY AND PLACED LOOSE IN THE RECYCLING BIN. PLASTIC LIDS SHOULD BE REMOVED FROM BOTTLES AND PLACED IN THE WASTE BIN.
