### Marrinup Excursion K - 6

We had perfect weather on Tuesday for our whole school excursion to **Marrinup**. Students walked the "**Marrinup Loop**" at the townsite, learned that their used to be a little town including a school at the site, enjoyed a delicious barbecue, visited the **Marrinup Falls** and then the students in years 3,4,5 & 6 visited the former **Marrinup POW** camp.

What made the day really special was that many parents came along.

'The townsite was established in the 1880s to harvest jarrah. Marrinup was located on the Pinjarra Dwellingup railway; this section of the railway opened in February 1910 and was named No 2 Siding and what is now Dwellingup was called Marrinup. This changed in July 1910 when it was renamed Marrinup and Dwellingup was given its present name.

Millars built a mill at Marrinup shortly after the rail was put through, the mill prospered until the onset of World War 1, the mill closed for the duration of the war as the workers enlisted and closed for the final time in the 1930s after the depression struck. Some families continued to live there and travelled elsewhere to work. What remained of the town was destroyed in the 1961 bush fire.'


again, it was used as a school. When it was no longer required there it was moved to Dwellingup in 1947 and is still in use (and lovingly maintained) by the RSL.

A bonus was a talk from a lady called Karen who talked to us about "Vinnie", her son's very clever therapy dog.



We all enjoyed our walk to the falls. Due to the fact that the creek is in a valley a 'microclimate' exists (the climate of a very small or restricted area, especially when this differs from the climate of the surrounding area), so plants can be seen there that don't grow in the jarrah forest.



**Mr Warren** spotted this grevillea on the Marrinup Falls walk. We think it might be the same species as the one which is painted on the hall.

'When Australians went to war in 1939, a labour shortage resulted. German and Italian prisoners were shipped from overseas to assist the Australian workforce. Camps were built in rural areas including the one at Marrinup. The POW camp provided farm labour and cut firewood to supply Perth (2,500 tonnnes every week). Conditions were comfortable but monotonous and the work was hard.'




### Dwellingup Trails & Visitors' Centre Excursion Years 4/5/6




