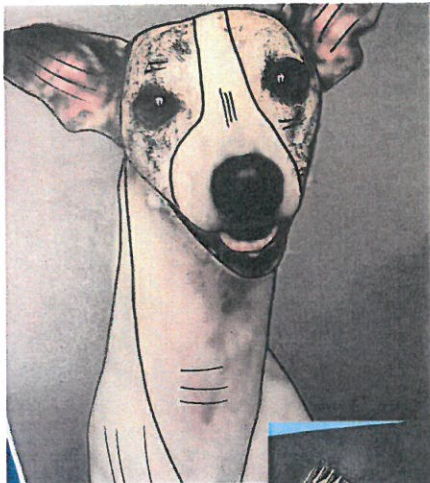
CHOOSE RESPECT

Years 4/5/6 Visual Arts

Students in years 4/5/6 have recently completed an arts project using the technique of **Collagraphy**. This term comes from the Latin word 'kolla' meaning glue and 'graph' meaning the activity of drawing. The theme of dogs was used to excellent effect.

The process the students carried out is detailed below:



STEP 1: Find a picture of a dog and cut it up into basic jigsaw pieces.

STEP 2: Use the pieces to trace around and then cut out corrugated card.

STEP 3: Cut out the pieces making sure that each piece has a different orientation.

STEP 4: Reconstruct to make the dog.



STEP 5: Roll ink onto the cardboard and make a print.



Step 6: Apply different coloured dye to each section.

Step 7: Complete background detail.

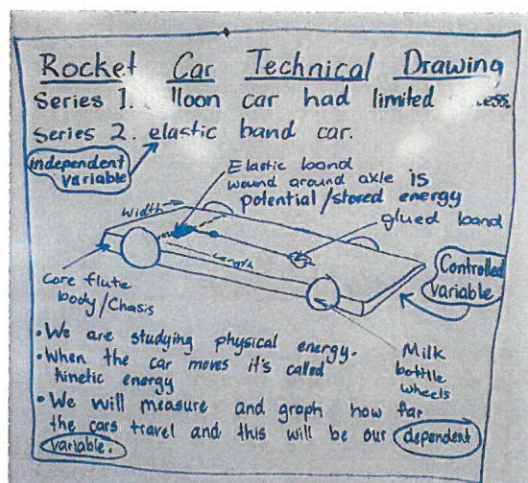


The very talented Mrs Shani Holster completed this stunning project with the students. She was very impressed with the effort and talent demonstrated by the students.

Years 4/5/6 Science

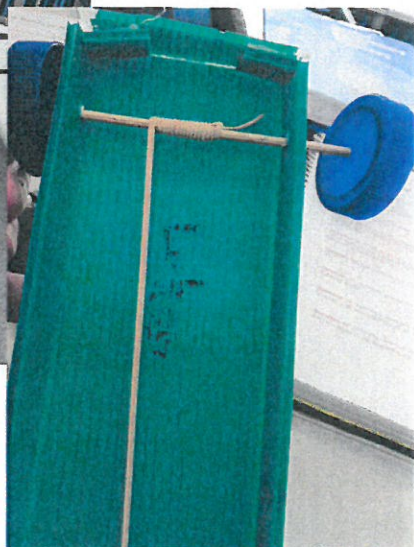
As part of Science, Maths and demonstration of responsible behaviour, students have been constructing **propulsion vehicles** using recycled materials, box cutter knives and hot glue.

Students have experimented with two types of propulsion, balloon air jet power and elastic bands stretched and wound around a drive axle. They are measuring their vehicles and how far they travel as well as understanding and modification for factors such as slip and grip, wheel diameter, weight, and surface types. When done students will produce graphs representing findings and compare and contrast outcomes in order to make evidence-based assertions as to the production, storage, transfer and release of physical energy

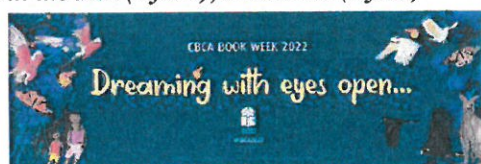

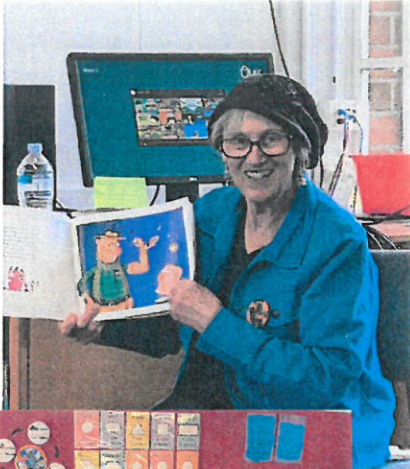

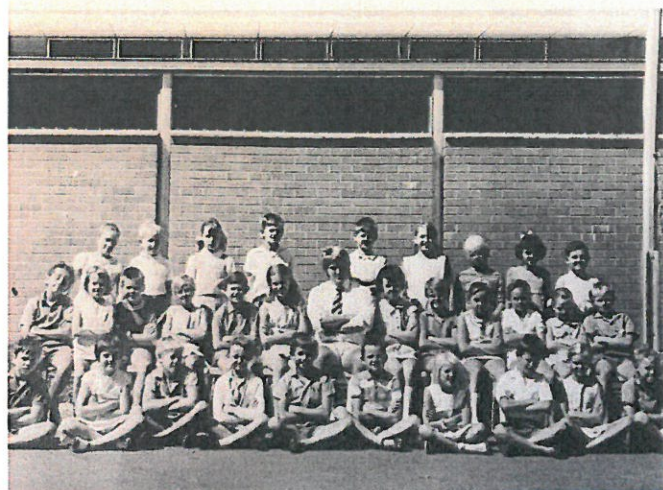
Right: Wendy from the IGA showed us a calendar that was given to customers in 1970.

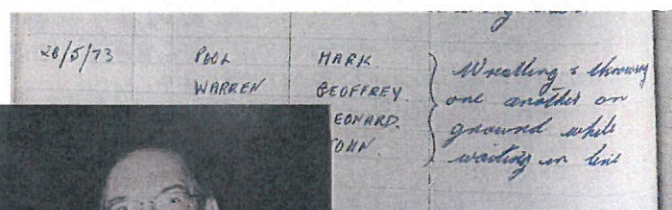
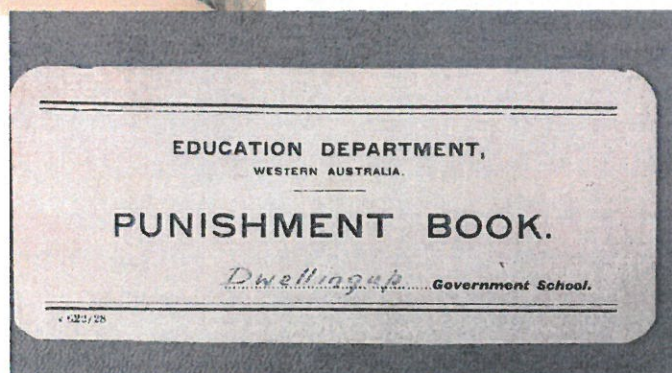

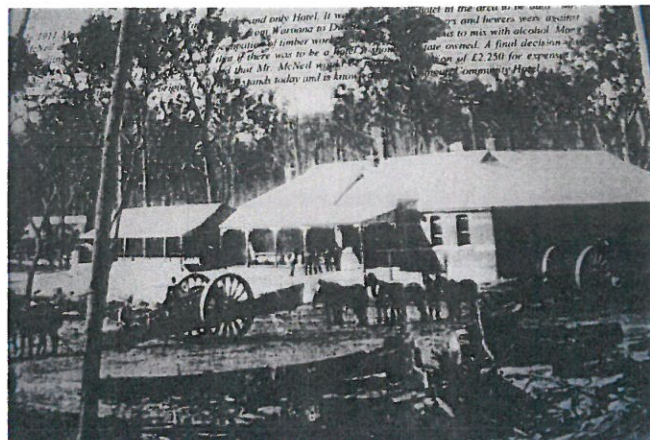


Above: This picture is taken about where the Japanese Garden is now. The student at the back on the right is our gardener, Mr Warren.
