### From Your Local Police...

Well although I have had my plans delayed for leaving this wonderful town, I can't say that I'm disappointed! I hope everyone has had a lovely start to 2022 so far and I am very much looking forward to continuing to work for our lovely community for the next couple of months at the very least.

With the heat of summer beginning fade our town is going to see an increase in both camping and tourist transiency, particularly over the next few months coming into Easter and the holidays that follow.

It is poignant then that we remind everyone to practice good road safety in the first instance. However, we'd also like you to remind children to do the same. 'Monkey see, monkey do' applies here, as you can tell your children as many important things as you like, but if WE don't wear seatbelts in vehicles or helmets whilst riding bikes then our children are going to follow our behaviour to their detriment.

Moving forward, we have seen a slight increase in the amount of opportunistic crime being committed in the greater Mandurah District which includes our townsite. Please keep in mind that there are 4 considerations that criminals base their activities on:

- Value
- Inertia
- Visibility
- Access

Value refers to how much a particular target is worth to the offender and it differs based on the person. Inertia simply refers to the size and weight of the target, which is why smaller goods are usually stolen versus bigger items. Visibility refers to the target being exposed to the offender as well as the exposure the offender places themselves and Access refers to how easily offenders can get to a target and what obstacles might impede them.

Offenders will always consider the benefits and risks and make choices based on the opportunities to commit a crime which is why locking doors and windows, securing keys to vehicles and not leaving high-valuables exposed becomes so important.



On Friday afternoons students in years PP-3 engage in Art, Technology and Computer rotations. What gorgeous Art!



We were impressed that this week Evie M and Nash (who live out of town) were brought into town by their parents and then rode to school from down the street.


