Year 6: Champion Bike Rider Sam Hill (Deegan), Peppa Pig (Rohan), Amiee absent.



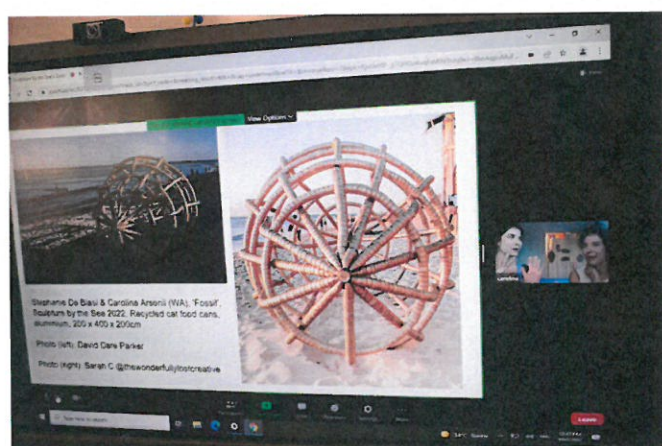

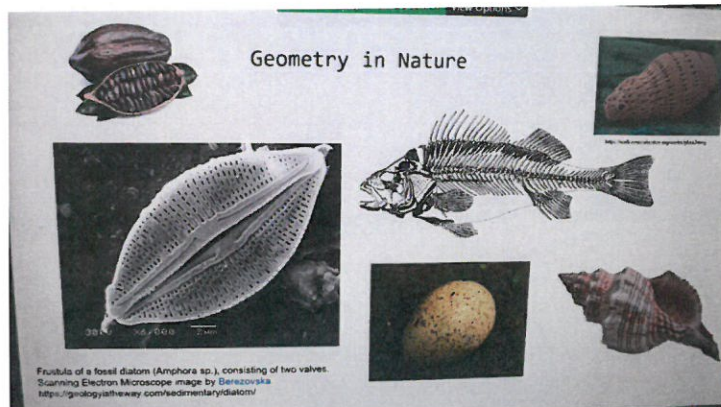
Daisy the Cow: Daisy looked gorgeous in a night sky cape, a rainbow wig and her signature straw hat.

Last Wednesday students in years 4/5/6 participated in a virtual “Sculpture by the Sea” experience. Sculptors **Stephanie De Biaisi** and **Carolina Arseni** appeared on-line via a Zoom meeting. They talked about what inspired them to make their amazing sculpture and then how they constructed it. **Stephanie and Carolina** called their sculpture “**Fossil**” and constructed it from 2500 recycled donated cat food tins (they chose them because they were coloured gold) and aluminium. The artists’ message is that we need to ask ourselves if we need the things we use and throw away.

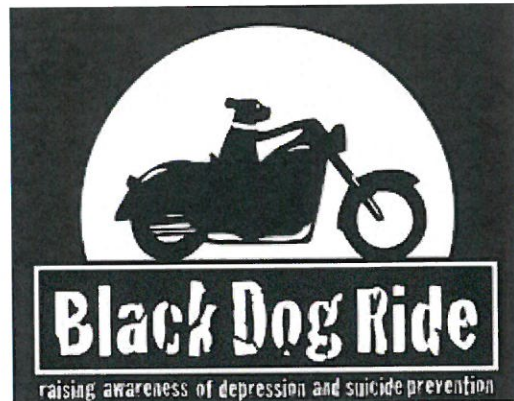
