# Aboriginal Season ~ Djeran (April – May)

This intermediate season linked to Bunuru and Makuru and was used to build and repair mia-mias (tents) for protection during the cooler weather and south-westerly winds in April and May.

Family groups began to travel inland to avoid heavy coastal rains and damp conditions and group fishing occurred at inland lakes, estuaries and wetlands with cobbler and mullet being speared in the river. Hunting was focused on kangaroos and kangaroo skins were prepared for winter.

**Health** – To improve the health of children and families so children no longer die of preventable illnesses and live past their fifth birthday.


**Education** – To create greater access to quality education and ensure that girls and boys are able to learn in safe and positive environments.

of origin on a world map. Thank you to Miss Davies and Mrs Evans for organising this most worthwhile activity.




#### Insect Theme K/PP

successful fundraiser was held


