

A meeting was held in the Dwellingup Community Hall on Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> April to update the community on aspects of the event. Information is attached to this newsletter providing information about how to register your property as temporary accommodation for the event with the Shire of Murray. Please note, need to be lodged before registrations Wednesday 2nd August.

# Registration Process Information

#### Step 1

Please review the information below. This is a list of requirements that you will need to meet to be eligible for the registration process.

Please make sure you can satisfy these requirements. During the registration process (completion of a form) you will be required to state that each of these criteria is met through a checklist.

Please note that the requirements differ slightly depending on whether you want to have a campsite or Holiday Accommodation and where your property is located.

#### Campsite

- I am the landowner of this property OR I have consent from the landowner.
- I am proposing a maximum of three campsites on the property. It is generally expected that this would consist of up to one caravan in town, and up to 3 caravans or tents sites out of town.
- If you are proposing more than three (3) campsites, please lodge a 'nature based park' application with the Environmental Health Department at the Shire of Murray.
- The campsites will be within the building setbacks on the lot, within an approved cleared area, and in the back yard of the property behind the dwelling.
- I will not undertake any clearing of vegetation on the lot to accommodate a campsite without prior approval. Please note that vegetation is not to be cleared without written approval from the Department of Environment and Water or the Shire of Murray.
- The campsites will be 2m or more from any dwelling or other structure on my property.
- If you are proposing more than one (1) campsite on your lot:
  - o The campsites will be placed so that they are 3m or more apart for separate groups.
- Access to adequate toilet facilities will be provided to accommodate the number of campsites on my lot AND The toilet facilities will be accessible for all occupants of the lot at all times.
- I will advise how many of each of the following there are at the property (in total):
  - o Toilets
  - o Showers
  - o Handbasins.
- All wastewater produced by the campsites on the lot will be collected in an approved container and disposed of at an official dump point (Pinjarra) OR Guests will be provided with access to a flushing toilet (connected to a septic or mains sewerage system).
- A suitable rubbish container will be provided for the campsites, and all rubbish will be disposed of properly.
- I will provide one (1) fire extinguisher (4.5kg Powder ABE portable fire extinguisher) in a location that is easily accessible for all campsites, or require that guest(s) bring a fire extinguisher.
- A first aid kit will be available on the lot in a place that is easily accessible by all guests, or require that guests bring a first aid kit.
- I will advise all visitors that they are to bring ample potable water supply with them to Dwellingup, if this is not supplied.

- The house number for my dwelling is easily visible from the road.
- All vehicles (including boats and trailers) on the lot during the event will be parked fully within the lot boundaries and not on the street, verge or neighbouring properties.



- There will be a caretaker/manager who lives on site or locally and can be at the property within 10 minutes and can be contacted at any time by guests.
- I will consult with AND notify relevant insurance providers of the temporary accommodation at the property.
- I will provide a management statement with my registration application outlining the following:
  - Operation management
  - o Rubbish collection
  - Maintenance
  - Noise
  - Fire escape route
  - Emergency contacts
  - o Security
  - Occupant rules
  - What to do/what to avoid during heavy rain events
  - Next of Kin details for guests (if known at the time of submission).
- I will provide a copy of the management statement to all guests and my neighbours. I am aware that once bookings are confirmed/guests have arrived, they will be required to sign the management statement and provide next of kin details. The management statement will be kept by the caretaker for the dwelling.
- I will provide an Emergency Plan with my Management Statement to all guests, my neighbours and the Shire of Murray.
- I will notify all adjoining neighbours that visitors will be staying at the property and will provide them with the contact details of the caretaker/manager.
- I will advise of the maximum total number of people staying on the property when submitting my registration to the Shire of Murray.

#### Holiday accommodation

- I am the landowner of this property OR I have consent from the landowner, and a copy of the landowner's consent is attached.
- Only bedrooms will be used for sleeping purposes.
- Guests are not permitted to stay in a shed, only in a building approved as a dwelling.
- A maximum of 12 people will be accommodated at each dwelling.
  - o The number of people sleeping in each room does not exceed the below:
  - o People aged 1 10 years have 3m2 per person
  - o People aged 10+years have 6m2 per person.
- There will be a caretaker/manager who lives on site or locally and can be at the property within 10 minutes and can be contacted at any time by guests.
- I will consult with AND notify relevant insurance providers of the temporary accommodation at the property.
- I will provide a management statement to my registration application outlining the following:
  - o Operation management
  - o Rubbish collection
  - o Maintenance
  - o Noise
  - o Fire escape route
  - Emergency contacts
  - Security
  - Occupant rules
  - What to do/what to avoid during heavy rain events
  - Next of Kin details for guests (if known at the time of submission).

I will provide a copy of the management statement to all guests and my neighbours.

I am aware that once bookings are confirmed/guests have arrived, they will be required to sign the management statement and provide next of kin details. The management statement will be kept by the caretaker for the dwelling.



- I will provide an Emergency Plan with my Management Statement to all guests, my neighbours and the Shire of Murray.
- My property has enough space for 1 vehicle per 4 guests to be parked AND A maximum of 5
  vehicles (including trailers and boats) will be parked on the property AND All vehicles (including
  boats and trailers) on my lot during the event will be parked fully within the lot boundaries and not
  on the street, verge or neighbouring properties.
- I have provided a suitable rubbish container at the property AND all rubbish will be disposed of properly.
- I will ensure smoke alarm(s) are fitted and working in the dwelling.
- I will notify all adjoining neighbours that visitors will be staying at the property and will provide them with the contact details of the caretaker/manager.
- The lot is compliant with the Shire's Firebreak Notice (if applicable).
- A first aid kit will be available on the lot in a place that is easily accessible by all guests, or require guests to bring this.
- The house number for my dwelling is easily visible from the road.
- I will advise of the maximum total number of people staying on the property when submitting my registration to the Shire of Dwellingup

#### Step 2

Two requirements of the registration process are to provide:

- 1. Landowner consent for the use of the property for temporary accommodation during the event; and
- 2. To provide a Management Statement for the use of the property during this time.

We have provided templates for both the landowner consent and the Management Statement.

Please download these documents and fill them out. Please note that the Management Statements differ slightly for Campsites and Holiday Accommodation. Please ensure you fill out the correct forms. You will be asked to provide the completed versions for the Shire's records during the registration process.

#### Step 3

Once you have completed your landowner consent and management plan, you are ready to begin the registration form.

Please note only one approval per lot over the time period will be issued.

Please choose from the options below, and you will be sent the appropriate registration form to fill out.

- 1. Campsite
- 2. Holiday Accommodation

#### Step 4

Once processed, you will receive an email notification on whether your registration was successful. Please note we require a minimum of six (6) weeks prior to event day to receive your application form.



The judges had a very difficult time judging 15 very creative "crows". This initiative





promotes the event around town and the crows delighted both locals and visitors to town.


