This intermediate season linked to Bunuru and Makuru and was used to build and repair mia-mias (tents) for protection during the cooler weather and south-westerly winds in April and May.

Family groups began to travel inland to avoid heavy coastal rains and damp conditions and group fishing occurred at inland lakes, estuaries and wetlands with cobbler and mullet being speared in the river. Hunting was focused on kangaroos and kangaroo skins were prepared for winter.




# **Aboriginal Culture**

Staff are completing Aboriginal Cultural Awareness Professional Learning at the park this term.

# Bibbulmun Track 25th **Anniversary**

This year is the 25th anniversary of the opening of the 'new' Bibbulmun Track. The Track was significantly realigned. extended from Walpole Albany and upgraded with the addition of timber shelters campsites in 1998.



To celebrate the milestone, a group of hikers will walk the 1000 kilometre track end-to-end commencing in Kalamunda on the 14th July. A community celebration will be held in each town as the walkers progress along the track. The Shire are supporting this event and have exciting plans!

The Bibbulmun Track Foundation have invited schools to take part. The walkers will arrive in Dwellingup on Tuesday 25th July (next term).

Our students will be involved by participating in the following activities:

- A group of students will join the walkers for the final leg as they approach Dwellingup.
- A walker will display and explain about the contents of their backpack.
- Students will complete a 1000-kilometre run! (Each Tuesday to Friday they will run around the cross-country track and record their laps.) This will start next week. Parents will be invited to join in and record their laps!

# "Talk for Writing" What is Talk for Writing?

"Talk for Writing is an engaging teaching framework developed by Pie Corbett, supported by Julia Strong. It is powerful because it is based on the principles of how children learn. It enables children to imitate the language they need for a particular topic orally, before reading and analysing it, and then writing their own version."

The program is endorsed by the Dyslexia Speld Foundation. This term Miss Fisher and Mrs Lamb will be completing two "masterclass" Professional Learning sessions. The sessions are titled, "Talk for Writing Early Years in Greater Depth" and "TFW Digging Deeper into Innovation". This means that our program will be even more amazing than it already is, and student outcomes will be even better!

Left: The theme for years 4/5/6 is "Down the Rabbit Hole" where they will explore adventure stories using "Alice in Wonderland" as the focus.


# "Dirt Matters"

As you know our school values caring for the environment. We already have programs in place to embed sustainability. We are in the process of updating our "Sustainable School's Plan" to further improve our practice. One change is to include the years PP/1/2/3 students in environmental activities.

Yesterday students in years PP/1/2/3 learned more about the jarrah forest and the different trees that are found in it. Students went up to the bushland and identified some different trees that grow in the jarrah forest and then drew the zig-zag leaves of the bull banksia.

Students in years 4/5/6 spent 20 minutes in the bush last week looking for wildflowers. We are going to make a 'flower' wheel showing flowers that grow in each of the Aboriginal six seasons. It was a bit sad that three weed flowers were found but only one endemic species.

In the last newsletter you would have read the "Two Stars and a Wish" list devised by the years 4/5/6 students. The staff have included the following ideas into our plan:




We are very excited about riding in the UCI international event and participating in associated activities that are being planned.


