## Excursion to Bindjarep Park Pinjarra

On Wednesday 31<sup>st</sup> May students travelled to Pinjarra to participate in an Aboriginal Cultural Excursion. **Bindjarep Park** is a 22ha sanctuary and is home to a number of wildlife species including the red-tailed black cockatoo.

Local Traditional Owner **Karrie-Anne Kearing** gave us a personal welcome and perspective of her lands.

Students learned about traditional uses of plants, enjoyed the exhibiting and explanation of artefacts and shared in the dreamtime and creation stories of local culture. Students also visited the site of remnants of an Aboriginal Reserve and learned more about former government practices.

On Monday 12<sup>th</sup> June staff will travel to **Bindjarep** after school for Professional Learning in Aboriginal Cultural Awareness. This P.L. will involve a visit to the Pinjarra Massacre site.

We thank **Karrie-Anne** and her daughter **Jedda** for sharing their amazing culture with us. It was a lovely experience which greatly benefitted us all.
